That the 5 Pillars of Islam detail the important ways that Muslims must live to show their faith to God. These are the publicly stating their faith, prayer, charity, fasting, and Hajj (pilgrimage).

The rules that Muslims follow have an important impact on how they live, the kind of art they have and how often they need to pray. There are even strict rules about what they can eat and how meat must be prepared. Muslims believe that if they follow in the footsteps of the Prophet Mohammed, then they will go to heaven.

Eid and Ramadan are two of the most important celebrations in Islam and across the Islamic world. They are times of reflection, and to show love towards God and other people. Charity and respect for others are an important part of Islamic practice.

Sikhs must follow 5Ks of Sikhism. These are clear about how Sikhs must live, dress, give charity to others and always be honest.

People who are not religious also follow their own laws and codes, and it is important to know what these are to treat others well. British values reflect this.

Sikh and Muslim people have contributed towards the British Commonwealth and are important communities within the United Kingdom.
